

## ARKANSAS FUTURE CAUCUS ANNOUNCES 39 BIPARTISAN, FUTURE-FOCUSED BILLS IN 2023

- <u>HB1045</u> (Sen. Ben Gilmore) To enhance economic competitiveness by phasing out the throwback rule.
- <u>HB1067</u> (Sen. Wade Andrews) To modify the law concerning residency requirements for certain firefighters.
- <u>HB1161</u> (**Rep. Ashley Hudson**) To create the Support for Pregnant and Parenting Students Act.
- HB1207 (Rep. Kendon Underwood) To create the Fast-Track Permits Act.
- <u>HB1244</u> (**Rep. Brandon Achor**) To amend the law concerning the issuance of and application for a digitized driver's license.
- HB1315 (Rep. Denise Ennett) To create the Seizure Safe Schools Act.
- HB1349 (Rep. David Ray) Concerning paid e-sports tournaments.
- <u>HB1380</u> (**Rep. Andrew Collins**) To amend the law regarding alcoholic beverages; and to amend the law regarding tasting events.
- <u>HB1385</u> (Sen. Breanne Davis) To ensure that healthcare providers are properly reimbursed by the Arkansas Medicaid Program for providing long-acting reversible contraception immediately and during postpartum.
- <u>HB1423</u> (**Rep. Stetson Painter**) To amend the law concerning the recount of ballots; and to amend election procedures.
- HB1452 (Rep. Justin Gonzales) To require hospitals in this state to comply with federal hospital pricing transparency regulations; and to require the Department of Health to enforce compliance with federal hospital pricing transparency regulations.
- <u>HB1456</u> (**Rep. Jimmy Gazaway**) Creating the Fentanyl Enforcement and Accountability Act of 2023; concerning fentanyl and other controlled substances; to establish increased penalties; and to declare an emergency.
- HB1457 (Rep. Tony Furman) To establish the Arkansas Poll Watchers Bill of Rights
  Act of 2023; to amend the law concerning poll watchers; and to amend the law
  concerning election procedures.
- HB1496 (Rep. RJ Hawk) To amend the law concerning abuse of an athletic contest official.



- HB1514 (Rep. Aaron Pilkington) To require that opioid overdose rescue kits be located on each campus of each public high school and state-supported institution of higher education.
- <u>HB1576</u> (Rep. Jamie Scott) To establish the Creating a Respectful and Open World for Natural Hair (CROWN) Act.
- HB1590 (Rep. Steven Walker) To allow a public school district that implements an alternate school calendar to use alternative methods of instruction for purposes of making up a missed school day.
- <u>HB1594</u> (**Rep. Matt Duffield**) To create a sales tax exemption for the Disabled American Veterans Organization.
- <u>HB1617</u> (**Rep. Nicole Clowney**) To amend the law concerning postmortem examinations; and to require or recommend that the state medical examiner conduct a postmortem examination in certain cases.
- HB1627 (Rep. Jeremiah Moore) To clarify that membership dues paid to hunting or fishing clubs are exempt from sales tax.
- <u>HB1653</u> (**Rep. Brit McKenzie**) To prohibit the purchase of small unmanned aircrafts manufactured or assembled by a covered foreign entity.
- HB1654 (Rep. Aaron Pilkington) To provide sales and use tax exemptions for data centers; and to provide a sales and use tax exemption for data center equipment, data center costs, certain services provided to a data center, and electricity used by a data center.
- <u>HB1662</u> (Rep. Chad Puryear) To exempt the sale of veterinary drugs and medicine if based on a prescription of a licensed veterinarian from the licensure requirements for a pharmacist and a pharmacy; and to declare an emergency.
- <u>HB1731</u> (**Rep. Cameron Cooper**) To increase the number of persons served by a daycare center that is exempt from the definition of "food service establishment".
- HB1757 (Rep. Grant Hodges) To create the Student Data Vendor Security Act.
- <u>HB1763</u> (**Rep. Jeff Wardlaw**) To establish maximum fees for a youth lifetime hunting and fishing license for residents ten (10) years of age or younger; and to authorize a transaction fee for certain transactions for hunting and fishing licenses.
- <u>SB66</u> (Sen. Tyler Dees) To create the protection of minors from distribution of harmful material act; to establish liability for the publication or distribution of material harmful to minors on the internet; and to require reasonable age verification.



- <u>SB68</u> (Sen. Jim Dotson) To amend the law that requires Holocaust education; and to establish Holocaust Education Week in the public schools of the state of Arkansas.
- <u>SB90</u> (Rep. Austin McCollum) To create the Automatic Occupational Licensure for Out-Of-State Licensure Act.
- SB93 (Rep. Ryan Rose) To amend the Arkansas code regarding a college of dentistry; and to clarify that the Commission on Dental Accreditation is the accrediting entity for a college of dentistry.
- <u>SB132</u> (Sen. Scott Flippo) To reduce the license application deadline for applicants to practice chiropractic in this state.
- <u>SB251</u> (Rep. Jeremy Woodridge) Concerning the administrative office of the Keep Arkansas Beautiful Commission; and to amend the duties of the state parks division.
- <u>SB262</u> (Rep. Josh Miller) To amend the Public Education Reorganization Act; and to remove the authority of the State Board of Education to require an administrative consolidation for certain school districts.
- <u>SB285</u> (Sen. Clarke Tucker) To amend the law concerning absences from school; and to provide for an excused absence for a student who accompanies the student's parent or legal guardian to vote.
- <u>SB334</u> (Sen. Greg Leding) An Act for the Department of Public Safety State Crime Laboratory Rapid DNA Technology Appropriation for the 2023-2024 Fiscal Year.
- <u>SB346</u> (Sen. Bart Hester) To promote permanency and to strengthen kinship placements for children in foster care.
- <u>SB407</u> (Sen. Matt McKee) To require energy produced from certain sources by considered carbon neutral; and to require energy produced from certain sources in conjunction with carbon capture technologies be considered carbon negative.
- <u>SB475</u> (Sen. Joshua Bryant) To amend the law regarding alcoholic beverages; to clarify the violation regarding the sale of controlled beverages by vending machine; and to authorize the sale through a dispensing machine under certain circumstances.
- <u>SB479</u> (Rep. Zack Gramlich and Sen. Jonathan Dismang) To amend the distributions from the General Revenue Fund Account; and to transfer revenues to the Restricted Reserve Fund to be used to address food insecurity and health needs.
