NATIONAL TASK FORCE ON STATE AI POLICY

A politically diverse coalition of Gen Z and millennial state legislators committed to ensuring AI policy is guided by effective governance—not partisan division. Task Force members lead responsibly on AI, promote cross-state collaboration, and share best practices to advance smart, ethical AI policy nationwide.

Why: A Defining Moment for AI Legislation

While some debates quickly become polarized or overly technical, and leaders navigate striking a balance between risk-mitigation and harnessing innovation, there's an urgent need for practical, bipartisan leadership that addresses how AI is already affecting jobs, education, public safety, democracy, and the future of governance.

The National Task Force on State AI Policy will meet that moment by empowering a new generation of lawmakers to lead thoughtfully and proactively. This group will serve as a national brain trust and advisory council, elevating young, statelevel leaders shaping the future of technology policy.

Who: Young Lawmakers Leading the Way

The Task Force is led by a select, bipartisan group of Gen Z and millennial state legislators who are solutions-oriented, future-focused, committed to ethical innovation. These lawmakers represent the next generation of leadership:

- Grounded in public service, not partisanship
- Deeply engaged with the challenges and promise of emerging technologies
- Trusted by peers and constituents to lead with integrity, foresight, and collaboration

Members will serve as:

- Amplifiers of state-level innovation and legislative experimentation
- Bridges to expert voices in industry, ethics, and academia
- Co-authors of the Bipartisan State AI Policy Memo
- Strategic advisors to the Future Caucus Innovation Lab's AI work

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What: Mission and Impact

- Equip Gen Z and millennial lawmakers to lead a national conversation on AI in a way that prioritizes shared problem-solving over partisan conflict.
- Serve as thought leaders and conveners for peers across the country, while offering bipartisan perspectives to members of the media.
- Promote cross-state collaboration and translate technical AI debates into clear, actionable guidance for lawmakers and the public.
- Advise on Future Caucus programming, communications, and lawmaker support related to AI policy.

How: Strategies and Activities

The Task Force will advance its mission in the following ways:

- <u>Host confidential briefings</u> to connect Gen Z and millennial legislators with ideologically diverse thought leaders, practitioners, and experts.
- <u>Convene accessible hearings</u> open to everyday Americans and the press to foster transparency around how AI policy decisions are made.
- <u>Organize site visits and learning trips</u> to deepen lawmakers' understanding of the risks and opportunities posed by AI technologies.
- <u>Support YouTubers, podcasters, and social media influencers</u> whose audience is Gen Z and Gen Alpha by offering facts, insights, and personal stories from a politically diverse cohort of next-generation legislators.
- <u>Present at industry conferences and policy forums</u> to share the legislative perspective and shape the broader AI governance conversation.
- <u>Author a first-of-its-kind Bipartisan State AI Policy Memo</u> to catalyze collaborative action on ethical AI governance—especially at a time when polarization threatens good ideas.
- <u>Fulfill lawmaker requests for AI policy support</u>, including: connecting with experts, implementers, or practitioners; organizing in-state briefings; researching existing policy solutions; facilitating peers connections with lawmakers from other states.

When: Launch and Timeline

- June-September 2025: Recruitment and onboarding of Task Force members.
- November 2025: Official launch at Futures Thinking Forum in Washington, D.C.
- January 2026: Legislative delegation trip to Las Vegas.
- Early 2026: Release of the Bipartisan State AI Policy Memo.
- Feb-Sept 2026: Ongoing peer briefings, public hearings, and policy tracking.
- September 2026: Updated policy memo with 2026 legislative session insights.
- November 2026: Task Force concludes.
